



**Civil Air Patrol TX – 645 AFA 4Q2025 Quarterly Report  
December 10, 2025**



Several major events occurred this quarter at the TX – 645 Majors Composite Squadron that will shape future focus and direction in the areas of Aerospace Education, Cadet Programs and Emergency Services.

Through AFA Chapter 416 financial support, Majors Composite Squadron received a Red Bird Advanced Training Device (ATD) G1000 Simulator in November. This simulator will be utilized to train CAP Pilots and Mission Air Crews; used in initial pilot training; available to local CAP units; as well as other aviation organizations. Our Community Partner, L3Harris, has donated secure room space that is being built out in the months of December and January. TX – 645 is in the process of developing program plans for scheduling, maintenance, and training as we move forward. This capability will allow TX – 645 and Group II Pilots to upgrade to G1000 aircraft. This technology shift supports increased availability for Search And Rescue (SAR) Missions and Waldo Missions (a specialized reconnaissance capability).

In the fourth quarter, TX – 645 supported several community service projects that included EAA Chapter 914 Pancake Breakfast, Majors Flying Club Scout Aviation Workshop, AFA Chapter 416 Golf Thing, AFA Essay Contest, and Community Seeds Annual Gala.



The Scout aviation event had 45 Scouts and was coordinated by Majors Flying Club, EAA, TX – 645 CAP, Boy Scouts of America, and many local aircraft owners who hangar their aircraft at Majors. During that event, 16 Orientation Flights were flown, and 44 Scouts earned their Aviation Merit Badge. The event was also attended by 22 family members while 64 volunteers made this happen.



At the end of September, TX – 645 cadets and Senior Members supported the AFA Golf Tournament by preparing “goody bags” for the participants.

October led to several major training events: Cadet Training and Education Program (CTEP) and the Training Leadership Course (TLC) at the TX Wing Head Quarters in Nacogdoches, TX over a 2.5-day period. TX – 645 sent 4 CTEP cadet participants in Air Force-styled academies for leadership training; 3 cadets to Airman Leadership School (ALS) and two Senior Members served as Staff. TX – 645 C/SSgt Sienna Brennan was selected as the Honor ALS Cadet. Lt Col Choya Shanahan and Lt Col Steve MacLaird completed Basic & Intermediate TLC (Training Leaders of Cadets). This training is essential to maintain our Quality Cadet Unit Award and supports our Cadet Programs Focus.

November included Tyler Basic Cadet Training (BCT), in which TX – 645 sent two SMs and three Cadets where they received commendations for their hard work.
